**Recommendations of Venkatachalliah Commission** on Constitutional Reforms (year 2000)

1. Cabinet size not to exceed 10% of legislature strength (at Central / State level) watered down to 15%.

2. For a strength of 543 M.Ps in Lok Sabha, this would still mean 81 member Jumbo cabinet.

3. For smaller states like Goa, Sikkim etc. where no. of legislators are less than 40, limit is 12. Still too high (30% of legislature strength). Ministerships distributed as a Largesse a. M.C. Chagla – 'Ministership – A badge of disloyalty rather than a reward for merit'

b. Professionals play second fiddle

# Secondary Largesse for left-out Legislators


- Chairmanship of Public Corporations (State Electricity Boards, Finance Corporation, Tourism Corporation etc.)

- Allocation of Rs. 5 crores (raised in 2011 from Rs.2 crores!) to be spent annually in their constituency as per their choice under MPLADS (Member of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme) (widely misused & misappropriated).



### I) No need to please M.L.A.s / M.P.s

Practice of selection of Cabinet from outside Parliament also prevalent in countries having parliamentary democracy e.g.

a) Germany : Full freedom to Chancellor to select his team from outside the Parliament.

b) Japan : PM can induct upto 50% ministers from outside Parliament.
